

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## Dr Eve Blezard, attended one of our meetings last year.

The University of Salford is now looking for research participants aged 55 and over for a project investigating the impact of the pandemic on how older people can remain socially connected in the places where they live. The research is trying to understand how places can become more age-friendly to support people's (re)connections over the coming months and years.

Stage 1: an interview in your home at a convenient time, asking how family, friends and local organisations and services support you, whether you have opportunities to socialise and your thoughts about local services and facilities.

Stage 2 (optional): a walk around your neighbourhood, discussing where you like to go and what you enjoy in your neighbourhood.
